

Anglican School of Ministry-Little Rock (ASM-LR) Admissions Policy

Statement of Non-Discrimination

Anglican School of Ministry admits students of any race, color, national origin, and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admission policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic and other school-administered programs. *Since ASM is a Christian theological school established for the purpose of preparing men and women for religious vocations (lay or ordained) within an orthodox, Christian context, ASM reserves the right to refuse admission based on religious affiliation.*

Admission to an Academic Program

Students applying for admission into one of ASM-LR's academic programs should follow the procedures outlined on the relevant program information sheet.

Admission as a Special Student

1. Students may apply for admission into ASM-LR as a for-credit student without entering a specific academic program. Such students are termed Special Students and need not supply original transcripts nor a letter of recommendation.
2. Credits earned as a Special Student may be applied to an academic program, but only after the student applies for admission into the desired program. Special Students applying for admission into an academic program must follow all admissions requirements for that program.
3. A student may take no more than 12 semester hours for-credit in the Special Student status, after which this student must enroll in an academic program or change to an Auditing Student.

Admission as an Auditing Student

1. Students applying for admission as an Auditing Student must complete an application for admission. The requirements for admission are the same as those for a Special Student, but there is no maximum number of classes for the Auditing Student.
2. Auditing students may audit as many classes as they desire. Auditing students enjoy the advantages of sitting in on the class and learning but they do not complete any assignments. However, auditors must be aware that the resources of the class (especially time available during lectures, seminars, and class discussions) must be primarily directed toward for-credit students. Instructors may, of necessity, have to limit the class participation of auditors.
3. Auditing students must fill out an enrollment form for each class they wish to audit. All fees (including late fees) on the current year's tuition and fees schedule apply.

4. For-credit students may audit as many classes as they wish for no charge provided they are taking at least one course during the same semester.
5. Courses taken in an audit status will be noted as such on the student's record. Students do not receive academic credit for an audited class.
